Music Curriculum at Carclaze

At Carclaze, we aim for every child to have access to high-quality, practical, and engaging musical experiences. We want all children to develop the self-confidence, skills, knowledge and understanding to develop a lifelong love of music, whilst also providing a secure foundation that enables them to take music further should they wish to.

At Carclaze, we offer an inspiring music provision which includes:

- Music delivered weekly across all Early Years, Key Stage 1 and 2 classes which uses the 2021 Model Music curriculum. Learning is enriched through a range of video and audio resources from 'Sing Up' and access to a range of tuned and untuned instruments.
- Weekly singing assemblies which cover a range of songs and themes.
- After school enrichment clubs which include performance and concert opportunities in school and the wider community.
- Musician of the Month We cover classical composers, traditions and popular artists from every continent but have also woven the 9 protected characteristics of the Equality Act, 2010 in our list of studied musicians.
- Opportunities for professional musicians to work alongside class teachers and deliver 12-week whole class instrumental teaching through the First Access Programme.
- A whole music team working within Cornwall Education Learning Trust, a passionate curriculum lead and peri staff to deliver individual and group tuition.
- Access to current Professional Development opportunities, resources, music projects and instrument hire through ASONE Cornwall Hub.

Outside the School Day Music Clubs

CHOIR – Thursday after school 3.05pm till 4pm (Years 2 to 6) with Mrs. Wright and Mrs. Wherry Singing in a choir builds confidence, self-esteem, teamwork and is good for mental health. And most importantly it's huge fun. Using the very popular Sing Up resource with professional studio based backing tracks. A whole range of songs are sung from the latest pop music, musical theatre, folk and classical. The choir will have the opportunity to perform in school, at the local church but also outside the school in venues such as Penrice Academy, Truro Cathedral, Hall for Cornwall and other Music Hub events when available. Past events have been at Penrice for a CELT Musical Bonanza and a Big Sing event at Hall for Cornwall. Bookings via Parent Pay at £1 per week.

RECORDER – Wednesday after school 3.10pm till 4pm (Year 3 to 6) Mrs. Wherry

Learning to play the recorder helps with creative thinking and brain development. It can develop fine motor skills and finger dexterity and builds hand eye coordination. Mrs. Wherry is a very experienced music teacher, having taught music at Carclaze for many years. During lessons you will cover the basics, begin to learn simple tunes, and develop complexity as you gain confidence. Bookings via Parent Pay at £1 per week. (Invitation only).

Instrumental Lessons:

Information is provided here directly from each of our visiting music teacher team. ALL lessons are provided in school, but the arrangement is directly between the visiting teacher and the parent. Parents should email the teachers with emails here. All are in the school day. Pupils may enter examinations in their chosen specialism and learners are encouraged to take part regularly in performances.

In-school Band Lessons – Callum Strange - Rocksteady

Fun and inclusive rock and pop band lessons for years 1- 6. Band lessons take place in school and there's no experience necessary! Rocksteady's unique curriculum includes up to 300 musicianship, performance and instrument skills. All instruments for lessons are provided. Choose if they shine on vocals, keyboard, drums, guitar or bass. Watch as your child boosts their confidence by performing in the end of term concerts. Children can achieve an exam-free, Ofqual-regulated, Trinity Music qualification. Rocksteady band leaders are highly trained musicians who make learning an instrument fun. Violin, Keyboard and Piano Lessons – Nigel Timms

Nigel studied violin with Michael Zabludow, former co-leader of the London Philharmonic Orchestra, piano with the composer Brian Chapple and conducting with Paul Bateman. After a

few years as a freelance musician in London, Nigel moved to Somerset and worked for the County Music Service for 25 years. He moved to Cornwall in 2018 to be closer to family and recently joined The Cornwall County Music Trust.

Our teaching in violin and keyboard tuition promotes the highest standards at all levels, encouraging the exchange of ideas and creating a warm and caring environment for our pupils conducive to learning. Teaching and learning should be fun; that's the first and most important thing. Our teachers will plan and structure their lessons to give as many different learning opportunities as possible. Vocal Lessons - Marc Jenyon

Vocal tuition includes the full spectrum of genres from classical, folk and musical theatre through to rock and pop. Our teachers will ensure pupils are aware of vocal health working with them to develop an understanding of the importance of warming up the voice in preparation for singing. There are limited subsidies for children who recieve school meals, children in care, those in receipt of personal independence payment (parent/carer or child) and the children of those currently serving in the British armed forces. You need to mark your entitlement to any subsidy during the sign up process (Apply for a Discount/Music Voucher). Please note that subsidies are available for one instrument per child only and cannot be claimed in retrospect.

And finally...

A word on instruments and practice: To progress, children do need to have an instrument to practice on at home. If possible, it's best to practice at least four times a week for 10 minutes. It's helpful if this is a good quality instrument for your child to make progress. A poor instrument can make progress trickier; the instrument can be more difficult to play, not stay in tune, or

reduce the pleasure your child has in playing it.

PRACTICE

It's a good moto to try to be your child's greatest fan and let your child's teacher be the one to give the instruction. Don't worry if your child isn't regularly practising, children can still make some progress from their lessons in school. Talk to your child's teacher and they can help you come up with a plan on how best to encourage your child to regularly practise. Little things like having a good space (not a cold room or with the television on) also help. Reward schemes like sticker charts also work well.

BUYING INSTRUMENTS

If you want to buy an instrument- Firstly, speak to your child's potential teacher for advice on what to purchase. They will be able to advise on the best instrument at the best price. Instruments can be purchased second hand as well as brand new. Many instruments can be also resold easily. Be careful about buying on eBay. Unless a reputable seller this can be a risky thing to do.

HIRE INSTRUMENTS

It is best to try the instrument before you buy! If you want to hire, you can rent an instrument short term through the ASONE Hub. They offer a hire scheme at ASONE Hub (asoneperform.com). The termly hire fee is between £22.00 and £39.00 (including VAT) and instruments can be hired up to four terms, at which point they are usually recalled, serviced and made available to other students.

Students in receipt of Free School Meals, Children in Care and children of Services Families can apply for a 50% subsidy on their instrument hire fee.
