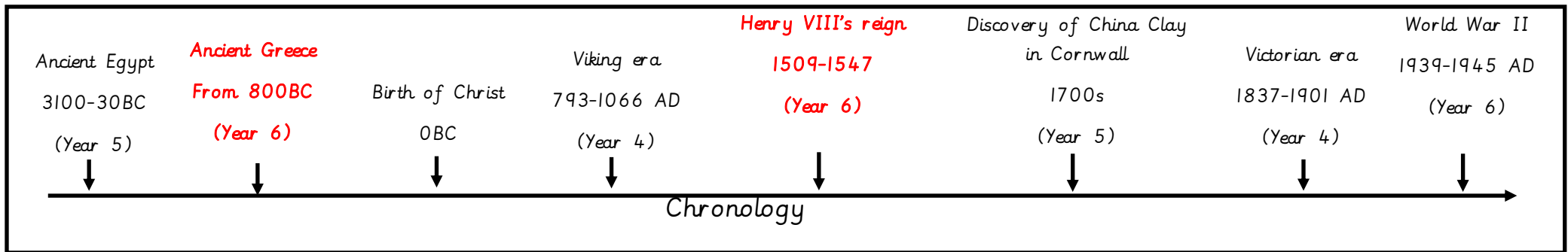

Reign	The period when a Monarch is on the throne of their country.
Monarchy	A system where one leader is given power.
Protestant	The name for followers of the Church of England, founded by King Henry VIII.
Catholic	The name for followers of the religion founded by the Romans, led by the Pope.
Parliament	A group of nominated individuals who govern their country.
Mythology	A collection of myths deriving from a particular period or religion.
Architecture	The design and production of buildings.
Olympics	A great game or festival taking place every four years, which was founded by the Ancient Greeks.

King Henry VIII founded the Church of England, breaking away from the Pope and the Catholic Church, so that he could divorce his first wife.

King Henry VIII was an influential monarch who reigned from 1509-1547.

Henry VIII was known for having six wives. (divorced, beheaded, died, divorced, beheaded, survived).

The Greeks had Gods who they worshipped for many different reasons: each God was responsible for a different area of life.

Many Greeks believed that these Gods on Mount Olympus ruled over their lives.

Many famous myths grew out of Greek mythology: including Theseus and the Minotaur.
